SHOW RULES

- 1 ENTRIES will be accepted from any member of the society, but no exhibitor may stage more than 1 entry in any 1 class from the same garden, except in FLORAL ART and COOKERY CLASSES.
- 2 All exhibits in the FLOWER, FRUIT and VEGETABLE classes must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 3 POT PLANTS must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO months prior to the show.
- 4 Member means paid up member, husband or wife of the member, children related to the member.
- 5 All entries must be received by the SHOW SECRETARY not later than WEDNESDAY 05th September
Exhibitors are asked to ensure that their entry forms are correctly completed, as mistakes cannot be rectified.
- 6 Late entries will be accepted, EXCEPT in classes 76 to 80 (floral art), **before 11am** on the day of the show.
- 7 The judges' decision is final. Prize money or awards may be withheld if exhibits are considered to be unworthy of the prize offered.
- 8 PRIZE MONEY will be available for collection on **show** day between 3.30 and. 4.15pm, any exhibit or prize money **NOT** collected by 4.30 pm will become the property of the Society.
- 9 STAGING. The show will be open for staging from **9 am**. An exhibitor's card must be obtained from the Show Secretary, and placed face downwards with each exhibit. Please name varieties if possible to stimulate interest.
- 10 JUDGING. This will commence at **12 noon**. Only authorised persons are allowed in the hall during judging.
- 11 PRIZE MONEY. This will be paid from 3.30pm onwards. Society awards will be presented at 4.15pm.
- 12 Containers will NOT be supplied for SECTION H (floral art). Vases will be provided where applicable and must be used.
- 13 All exhibits in SECTIONS A, B, C, D, & F will be donated to worthy causes unless an offer is made to purchase. RESERVED SECTIONS are E, G, H & I, (DOMESTIC, HANDICRAFT, FLORAL ART and CHILDREN'S) Classes 43 - 45 (POT PLANTS). Exhibitors may start to remove their exhibits at **4pm**
- 14 POINTS. Points will be awarded on the basis of five points for first, three points for second, and one point for third. In the event of a tie, the award will be given to the exhibitor with the most firsts etc.
- 15 All cups to be held for one year, and must be returned to the Show Secretary by the end of JULY 2019.
- 16 A NOVICE is a person NOT having won the BALMORE CUP three times.

62	CARROT CAKE. 6 oz dark brown soft sugar, 2 large eggs at room temperature, 4 fl oz sunflower oil, 7 oz wholemeal self-raising flour, 1 ½ level teasp bicarb of soda, 2 rounded teasp mixed spice, grated zest 1 orange, 7 oz carrots, peeled and coarsely grated, 6 oz sultanas, 2 teasp vanilla extract Pre-heat the oven to gas mark 3, 325°F (170°C). Begin by whisking the 6 oz (175 g) sugar, eggs, vanilla essence and oil together in a bowl using an electric hand whisk for 2-3 minutes. Then sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda and the mixed spice into the bowl, tipping in all the bits of bran that are left in the sieve. Now stir all this together, then fold in the orange zest, carrots and sultanas. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and bake on the centre shelf of the oven for 1 hr 15 mins until it is well risen and feels firm and springy to the touch when lightly pressed in the centre. use the juice of the orange mixed with icing sugar to ice the top of the cake.
